

**ORDINANCE 629
CITY OF DAYTON, OREGON**

An Ordinance Renaming to Commerce Street the Portion of the 20 Foot Currently Unnamed Alley Running Approximately 715 Feet between and parallel to Ferry Street and Alder Street, Connecting 2nd Street and Water Street in Dayton, Oregon.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Dayton has declared its intention to rename to Commerce Street a portion of the 20 foot currently unnamed alley running approximately 715 feet between and parallel to Ferry Street and Alder Street, connecting 2nd Street and Water Street in Dayton, Oregon; and

WHEREAS, the renaming of said street is in the best interest of the City and the surrounding area as the City carries out its development and transportation plans; and

WHEREAS, notice of the proposal to rename the street was provided as required by ORS 227.120; and

WHEREAS, the Dayton Planning Commission considered this matter on September 10, 2015, and recommended the renaming of said street to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, on October 19, 2015, the City Council held a public hearing on the matter.

The City of Dayton, therefore, ordains as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to ORS 227.120, approximately 715 feet of unnamed alley between and parallel to Ferry Street and Alder Street, connecting 2nd Street and Water Street, shall be named Commerce Street; and

Section 2. The City Recorder is directed to record and file this ordinance with the Yamhill County Clerk, Yamhill County Assessor, and Yamhill County Surveyor; and

Section 3. This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days after adoption by the City Council.
